"(viii) Recalling the earlier decision of the Syndicate authorising him to set up a research unit under the School of Environmental Studies, he pointed out that he had discussions on the matter with Dr. N. L. Ramanathan, Director, Environmental Division, Department of Science & Technology Government of India who suggested that in the interest of securing funds from the Government a unit with a permanent officer be set up at the earliest. In order to facilitate this, he proposed to have Dr. K. P. Balakrishnan, Reader, Dept. of Marine Sciences, transferred along with his post to the School of Environmental Studies as he has done all the preliminary work in connection with the setting up of the unit.

ON IMPORTANT DRUPT OF THE VICE. CHANCELLOR ON IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE UNIVER-SITY SINCE THE LAST MEETING

1) He had a further round of discussions at Trivandrum on 18-2-1980 at the Office of the Commissioner for allocation of grants to Universities, at which the Cochin University's on the basis of facts and form was re-emphasised and argued on the basis of facts and figures. As per present indications,

the University expected an increase in Govt. grants on the non-plan side from Rs. 44 lakhs to Rs. 60 lakhs and on the Plan side from Rs. 18 lakhs to 45 lakhs for 1980-81. With this the University should be able to meet its commitments better during the next financial year.

- 2) The Conference of Vice-Chancellors of Southern Universities held at Cochin on 25-2-1980 was hosted by the University. Twelve Universities were represented at the Conference. Among the major decisions of the Conference was the one providing for reciprocal recognition among the Universities of their degrees, provided the entrance qualifications, duration of the courses and standards of attainment are the same.
- 3) During his recent visit to New Delhi, he had discussions with the Vice-Chairman and the Secretary, U. G. C., about the prospects of immediate assistance to the Cochin University.
- 4) While in Delhi, he discussed with the officials of the GDR Embassy about the University's intention to start a Post-graduate course in printing technology. The proposal was welcomed. Steps would have to be taken for preparing a blueprint for a School of Printing Technology.

- 1) The Accounts upto 31-1-1980 presented by the Director was examined and accepted. It was also noted that the expenditure may be furnished with more details of claims
- 2) Creation of the post of Driver: The Director has in future. pointed out that order have been placed for the purchase of Van to the School and the delivery of the Van is expected shortly. So he has recommended the creation of the post of a Driver in the School of Continuing Education.

The Committee recommends that a post of Driver may be sanctioned in the School of Continuing Education. Pending regular appointment on notification the Director may be permitted to make suitable arrangements for filling the post on temporary appointment.

- 3) Payment of Travelling Expenses and other remuneration to Staff attending Contact Classes. Director expressed the desirability of a simple and easy procedure for settlement of the above claims of teaching and non-teaching staff attending Contact classes at out station, so that there may not be any discontent or difficulty to the staff mainly drawn from outside for these classes. The proposals in this regard was examined and the Committee recommends that:
 - i. The Director be authorised to make payment of the allowances at rates recommended (appended) on acquittance recorded by receiving officers in a Register for this purpose.
 - ii. The payment may be regularised by drawing a consolidate T. A. bill by the Director.
 - iii. The Director may record a certificate of disbursement and acquittance in the bill which may he accepted as proof of disbursement and no sub voucher insisted.
 - iv. Considering the special nature of the work involved non-teaching staff attending contact classes may be provided moderate accommodation at the outstation at University Cost in addition to TA DA admissible as per rules.
- 4) Response Sheet—Review of—Remuneration: Director pointed out that the response sheets received have to be reviewed and returned to the students with review notes thereon. The School is not having permanent staff for this and as such this work has to be got done on the lines of value ation of answer books. The Committee considered the special aspects of the matter and recommends that the review may be got done at the rate of Re. 1/- per paper and the Director be authorised to make necessary arrangements and payments in
- 5) Open market purchase of Paper: Director reported that one ream of paper is urgently required for the School and

there is no possibility of getting the same at concessional quota rates. He has therefore requested sanction to puschase one ream of paper from open market. Committee recommends that the Director may be authorised to make open market purchase of one ream of paper. The approximate cost involved is Rs. 12,000/-

(1) Enhancement of course advance: Sanction had already been given for a course advance of Rs. 20,000/- to the School. According to the present practice of working of the School almost all payments relating to the School is made by the Director. Separate detailed accounting rules can be formulated after the School has been functioning for some times. In the meantime, the course advance was found insufficient to meet demands for expendiure. Considering the special nature of the transaction if is not in the interest of the School to delay payment. So the Director had requested for additional funds and the Vice-Chancellor after considering the request has enhanced the limit of course advance to Rs. 50,000/- subject to ratification by Syndicate. Committee records that the action of the Vice-Chancellor in enhancing the course advance to Rs. 50,000/- may be ratified. Committee also notes that no separate permanent advance is necessary for the School as these items can aise be met from the Course Advance. So the Committee also recommends closure of the Permanent Advance sanctioned to the School.
