Item No. 166.02 Report of the Vice-Chancellor on important developments in the University since the last meeting of the Syndicate.

- (a) Preparations for the observance of the World Environment Day on June 5 are now complete. It has been possible for the University-in collaboration with numerous other agencies-to mobilise about 200 scientists, engineers, technologists administrators and others to participate in a seminar on the developmental and environmental problems of Kerala in general and of Cochin in payticular. The eminent nuclear scientist Dr. Raja Ramanna is inaugurating the seminar. The education Minister Sri T. M. Jacob will address the public function. The Syndicate may approve the University making a contribution of Rs. 2500/- towards the expenses.
- (b) The foundation stone of the multi-storeyed hostel sanctioned by the U. G. C. will be laid by the Minister of Education Sri. T. M. Jacob at the Trikkakara campus at 4 p. m. on June 5, 1982.
- (c) The University is participating in the Western Ghats Coordinated Action Research Project sponsored by the Planning Commission for which an assistance of Rs. 31/-lakhs will be available over a period of three years.
- (d) The Department of Physics has completed a very successful refresher programme in Laser Spectroscopy, which is an important and emerging area in Science and Technology. The programme was sponsored by the UGC for the benefit of teachers.

- (e) The Government of India has constituted a Visiting Committee to consider giving approval for the M.Tech. Programme being offered by the Department of Electronics and Communication System of this University. The Committee is due to visit the University in the last week of June.
- (f) The University will be organising a National Seminar on 'Environmental Law' under the auspices of the Department of Law in December 1982. The U.G.C. is sponsoring the Seminar.
- (g) As proposed at the fast meeting of the Syndicate, the Expert Committee has been enlarged by including the following people:-
 - 1. Prof. Dr. L. S. Chandrakant Member (Former Educational Adviser (Tech) to the Govt. of India) Indian Institute of Management Bangalore.
 - 2. Prof. Dr. P. V. Indiresan Member Director, Indian Institute of Technology, Madras.
 - 3. Shri P. K. Umasankar Member Commissioner for General Education Government of Kerala, Trivandrum.
 - 4. Prof. T. B. K. Menon Convener
 Pro-Vice-Chancellor

The Syndicate may approve this enlargement of the Expert Committee. The Committee is being requested to submit its report by the end of August 1982 at the latest.

- (h) Mrs. Anna Malhotra, Secretary, Ministry of Education, Government of India, visited the University on May 8, and released at a well attended function the proceedings of the symposium on computers held some time ago in connection with the annual convention of the National Academy of Sciences.
- (i) The University expects to get some funds from the U. G. C. very soon for the development of the engineering and technology departments. The U. G. C. has agreed to consider our urgent requirements in this regard, and a meeting between the Vice-Chancellor and the Chairman of the U. G. C. is being fixed for the purpose.
- (j) Some students of the Department of Ship Technology residing in Hostel No. III had indulged themselves in acts of gross indiscipline by forcibly occupying certain rooms in Hostel No. III. The situation was dealt with firmly.
 - Dr. M. G. Krishna Pillai, Hon: Warden, University Hostel, Trikkakara campus has been replaced by Prof. N. Ranganathan, by the Vice Chancellor in exercise of his statutory powers.
- (k) The progress of construction works entrusted with the K. S. C. C. was discussed with its new Managing Director Sri. M. C. George. He has agreed to complete the Common Facilities Centre and the Gymnasium before December 31, 1982 and the Administrative Block by March 31, 1983.
- (I) The Vice-Chancellor has been nominated by the Union Minister of Education on the Board of Governors of the IIT, Madras, who have in turn nominated him also on their Finance Committee.

(m) The Vice-Chancellor has been nominated by the State Government on the State Committee on Science & Technology and also on its Executive Committee.

Item No. 166.17. Delegation of powers to the Vice-Chancellor and Heads of Departments - consideration of.

The Syndicate considered, along with the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance & Purchase, the proposal for delegating various administrative and financial powers to the Vice-Chancellor.

Resolved that the following powers be delegated to the Vice-Chancellor subject to review at the end of two years.

A. Administrative Powers

- (i) Disciplinary powers over students as provided for in Statute 73 (xi) of the First Statutes, 1980.
- (ii) Declaration of probation of all employees.
- (iii) Confirmation of employees subject to the general rules governing the same.

B. Financial Powers:

1. Works:

- (a) To sanction all works, original or repairs the cost of which does not exceed Rs. 50,000;- at a time, where the work is one included in a scheme approved by the Syndicate, and where funds have been provided for in the University budget.
- (b) To accept tenders for works and tenders of quotations for supplies upto Rs. 1 lakh where the lowest, and, in other cases, upto Rs. 25,000/- and to dispense with tenders for works costing upto Rs. 15,000/- in case of urgency.
- (c) To sanction advances for departmental purposes exceeding Rs. 500/- and upto a limit of Rs. 75,000/- against specific budget provision, where the concerned scheme has been sanctioned by the competent authority.
- (d) To regularize excess expenditure over estimates due to excess in tender and upto 30% for other reasons such as escalation of costs etc. or Rs. 10,000/- whichever is higher.

2. Purchases:

The power to sanction purchases covered by budgetary provision upto a sum of Rs. 50,000/- at a time, subject to observance of store purchase rules.

Resolved further that Heads of Departments be impowered to make purchases not exceeding a sum of Rs 5,000/- at a time subject to observance of store purchase rules, where the expenditure is covered by budgetary provision.

The Committee noted that the total number of vacant U. G. C. Fellowships available for award is four under general category and one for SC/ST candidates.

The Committee decided that candidates applied for UGC Fellowships who were subsequently awarded CSIR Fellowships be given an opportunity to express their opinion about the retention of the CSIR Fellowships or to opt for the UGC Fellowships. In ranking candidates the re-prints enclosed along with the application and the details of publications given in the application form alone be considered for scoring index marks allotted for publications.

If he decides to retain the CSIR Fellowship, the reserved UGC Fellowship for SC/ST candidates be awarded to Syed Ismail Koya upto 31-1-1982 from the date of the termination of his Fellowships in the scheme where he was originally engaged for research work.

Shri Rajiv D., SC/ST research scholar from the Department of Law be given the reserved Fellowship with effect from 1-2-1982.

Recommendation of the committee constituted by the Syndicate at its meeting held on 2-6-1982 as per Item No. 164.05 for considering concessional travel in University vehicles.

The Committee discussed the various issues concerning the operation of University vehicles. Its recommendations arrived at on the basis of consensus are given below:

- (1) Dependents of employees residing in University quarters may continue to enjoy travel facilities in University vehicles at special rates to be fixed i. e., at rates substantially higher than the current rates But School/ College going children of employees will be treated on a par with students of the University for the purpose of concessional travel on University vehicles.
- Bus fare (pass & coupons) be increased by 20% in respect of University employees, Class IV employees excepted.

- (3) There be no increase in fare in respect of Class IV employees and students for the present. However, part-time students who are employed shall be charged at the rates fixed for dependents of University employees.
- (4) The number of bus stops on Trikkakara Tripunithura route be reduced from the present 44 to 29, with provision for a maximum of two additional stops, depending on the number of persons boarding from such stops contemplated.
- (5) The tempo van service between campus and national hignway be re-scheduled for the convenience of staff and students, cutting a few trips between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and introducing a couple of trips between 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. The Tempo van service may be run regularly and without interruption.
- (6) The tempo van now under repair may be put into operation as soon as possible,
- (7) Coupons will be available only for students, and in the case of others for travel between campus and national highway only.
- (8) The design of the present buss pass may be improved.

 The Committee noted the views expressed by the representativas of the emyloyees and students in favour of the purchase of a new bus.

Employees representatives also proposed that the departure time of the University bus from Trikkakara in the evening be changed from 4.15 p.m. to 4.10 p.m.
