In exercise of the powers conferred by section 24(ii) read with section 42(i) of the CUSAT Act 1986. The Academic Council at its meeting held on 01/08/1998 resolved to make the following Regulations/Amendments to Regulations for:-

- (1) LL.B - Revised Regulations and scheme of examination. (Appendix I)
- (2) LL.B^M - Amendment to the existing regulation (Appendix II)
- (3) M.A (Translation) in Russian/German (two year Full Time) Course Regulations (Appendix III)
- (4) P.G. Certificate Course in Japanese - Scheme of examination (Appendix IV)
- (5) Integrated Diploma in German and Russian (one year Part-Time) - Scheme of examination (Appendix V)
- (6) The scheme of examination of the courses conducted under the Department of Foreign Languages be modified as " A separate minimum of 40% is recommended instead of 50%". An aggregate of 50% is necessary for securing a pass mark in all courses.
- (7) A pass in C.A. course be recognised as the qualification for Ph.D registration, provided
 - i) The candidate has basic degree and
 - ii) The candidate is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India(FCA).
- (8) B.Tech Courses (COE) - Revised Regulations and Scheme of examination (Appendix VI)
- (9) B.Tech Courses under the University - Amendments to the existing Regulations (Appendix VII)

A P P E N D I X - I

Revised Regulation for Bachelor's Degree Course in Law (LL.B.)

That the Regulation for Bachelor's Degree Course in Law published in the Kerala Gazette dated 1st February, 1994 and the amendments thereto, be replaced by the following revised regulations.

Regulations for Bachelor's Degree in Law (LL.B.)

1. The Bachelor's Degree in Law (LL.B.) shall consist of regular course of study for a minimum period of three years after graduation.
2. The course of study shall be regular attendance at the requisite number of Lectures, Tutorials and practical training.
3. The medium of instruction shall be English.
4. Eligibility:

A person who has passed the Bachelor's Degree with 40% marks in any discipline of a University recognised by the Cochin University of Science and Technology can apply for admission to the course. There will be no relaxation in favour of SC and ST students on the percentage of marks for admission to the course. Candidates who have appeared for the qualifying examination may also apply in anticipation of their results. The mark lists obtained in the qualifying examination shall be produced at the time fixed by the Department. Those who fail to produce mark list shall be removed from the rolls. There will be no relaxation in favour of SC and ST students on the percentage of marks for admission to the course.

5. Procedure for selection:
 - (i) Selection shall be made on the basis of the marks in the entrance test.
 - (ii) In making selection for admission the pattern of reservation under U.O. No.Ac.A1/94/78 dated 22-3-1980 shall be applicable.
 - (iii) Five percent of the seats shall be reserved for the teaching and non-teaching staff of the Cochin University of Science and Technology.
6. Curriculum:
 - (i) The curriculum shall consist of 21 compulsory, 3 optional and 4 compulsory practical training papers prescribed by the Bar Council of India vide letter No. L.E.(Cir)4/1997 dated 21-10-1997.
 - (ii) The optional papers will be chosen and offered by the School from among the optional papers in the Syllabus.

- C.01 Legal Language and Legal Writing
- C.02 Constitutional Law
- C.03 Contract I (General Principles of Contract and Specific Relief)
- C.04 Family Law I
- C.05 Tort and Consumer Protection Laws
- C.06 Law of Crimes
- C.07 Criminal Procedure Code, Juvenile Justice Act & Probation of Offenders Act
- C.08 Labour Law
- C.09 Administrative Law
- C.10 Jurisprudence
- C.11 Contract II (Indian Contract Act, Partnership Act, Sale of Goods Act and other Specific Contracts)
- C.12 Family Law II
- C.13 Law of Evidence
- C.14 Property Law (including Transfer of Property Act and Easement Act)
- C.15 Civil Procedure Code and Limitation Act
- C.16 Company Law
- C.17 Environmental Law
- C.18 Interpretation of Statutes
- C.19 Human Rights and International Law
- C.20 Arbitration, Conciliation and Alternate Dispute Resolution Systems
- C.21 Land Laws (including ceiling and other Local Laws)

(iv) The Optional papers are:

- O.01 Criminology and penology
- O.02 Conflict of Laws
- O.03 International Economic Law
- O.04 Law Science and Technology
- O.05 Intellectual Property Law
- O.06 Taxation Law
- O.07 Insurance Law
- O.08 Banking Law including Negotiable Instruments

(v) Practical Papers are:

- P.01 Drafting, Pleading and Conveyancing
- P.02 Public Interest Lawyering, Legal aid and para Legal Services.
- P.03 Professional Ethics, Accountancy for Lawyers and Bar Bench Relations.
- P.04 Moot Court, pre trial preparations and participation in trial proceedings.

7. Examinations:

- (i) There shall be a University Examination at the end of each year. Candidates having not less than 75% (Seventy five) attendance in each paper shall alone be admitted to the examination. 9% (9 per cent) of the required percentage of attendance in each paper may be condoned by the Director of the School. Candidates detained for shortage of attendance may be permitted to rejoin the course in the respective class to make up the shortage.
- (ii) For each written paper carrying 100 marks, 25 marks shall be set apart for being awarded by way of internal assessment and 75 marks for the written examination. The internal assessment shall be made on the basis of overall performance during the year such as regularity of attendance, preparation of assignment and test paper scoring.
- (iii) The performance in practical training papers shall be assessed internally.
- (iv) A candidate who is presented for the examination in an year shall be entitled to pursue his studies for the next year of the course.
- (v) There shall be a viva-voce examination carrying 100 marks at the end of the third year. The board shall consist of an external expert who shall be either a lawyer or judicial officer, sitting or retired and two members of the faculty.

8. Pass minimum and classification:

- (i) A candidate who secures not less than 50% of the total marks in a paper shall be declared to have passed the examination in that paper.
- (ii) A candidate who passes in all the papers and secures 50% or more of the aggregate marks for all the three years but less than 60% of such marks shall be declared to have passed the whole examination in second class.
- (iii) Successful candidates with 60% marks and above in the aggregate for all the three years shall be declared to have passed the whole examination in first class.
- (iv) Successful candidates with 75% marks or above in the aggregate for all the three years shall be declared to have passed the examination with distinction provided he passes all the examinations within the period of the whole course.
